EUROPE4ALL IN SHORT

The project 'Europe4All - European Digital Cultural Heritage and Values for Migrant Empowerment and Inclusion in Adult Education' aims at raising awareness of the diversity of European cultural heritage and values and supporting intercultural dialogue and building mutual understanding between new arrivals and receiving communities. Young learners with and without migration backgrounds work together to create videos documenting and exploring shared experiences. Videos include a wide range of contemporary and historical examples of cultural heritage and its relevance to these experiences. By doing this, learners will open up a conversation on these values.

The project will develop practical tools for the production of digital films by young adults with and without histories of migration together and will design materials to give adult educators specific tips on how to use the videos.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES OF EUROPE4ALL PROJECT

- help adult immigrants learn more about the cultural heritage and values shared by people in Europe
- help (young) adults gain creativity skills through video developing of cultural heritage products
- improve skills in intercultural communication
- provide educators and/or non formal trainers who support adult learners with tools to raise awareness on the importance of Europe's cultural heritage, and values

Europe4All Video Library: A collection of videos produced by migrants and local natives together

The Europe4All Video Library now contains 25 videos about European Values and Cultural Heritage, produced in the six partner countries. You may access the Video Library here. After finalising the video production, we collected feedback about the videos and about the development of video production skills of the participants. Europe4All Handbook for Adult Educators

We are currently finalising the content of our Europe4All Handbook for Adult Educators. The handbook is a comprehensive guide developed through a collaborative effort of the partnership. The Handbook aims at providing adult educators and trainers with practical tools to engage learners in a dialogue about European values and Cultural Heritage. It is structured into five parts.

The first part is about European Values, which explores the six fundamental EU values listed in the Lisbon Treaty through text-based content. The second part delves into the importance of cultural heritage in Europe. The third part provides examples of good practices related to promoting EU values and cultural heritage. The fourth part showcases four examples of storytelling related to EU values and cultural heritage. The fifth and final part provides six learning units with didactical frameworks and exercises.

Each one of those learning units use one of the Europe4All videos to work with learners on the topics of cultural heritage and values in Europe. Additionally, there is a self-assessment tool for educators to evaluate the learners' understanding of EU values and cultural heritage, as well as the lesson plans and their learning outcomes.

The materials developed in this handbook will be translated into the national languages of our project's partner countries. This will ensure that educators across Europe can access these resources in their native language.

Learning Teaching and Training Activity

The partners met on 13, 14 and 15 of June 2023 in Volos, Greece for a Learning, Teaching and Training Activity. During this 3-day event the participants had the opportunity to test the learning units developed for the Handbook for adult educators and get feedback from the participants on the handbook.

Vivid discussions have taken place and interesting questions on Cultural Heritage and European Values have been answered, and collected in this **video**.

The event has also hosted two external guest speakers, who shared their experiences on the employability of migrants and other vulnerable groups as well as on human rights.

Moreover, the grounds have been set for the production of the Europe4All Multimedia Manifesto. Partners presented and discussed their ideas on the Manifesto and agreed on the next steps and deadlines.
